To prepare for the interview process:

State Officer Interviews will be conducted PRIOR to the State Leadership Conference according the following schedule:

- Tuesday, April 13, 2010 – 9:00 PM – Officer Candidates Report to Des Moines
- Wednesday, April 14, 2010 – All Day – State Officer Interviews
- The Iowa FFA will secure hotel rooms for Tuesday night and Wednesday (if needed) for all candidates. If your FFA Chapter is in Des Moines on Wednesday, you will be able to move back with your chapter. Your FFA Chapters will be invoiced for your portion of that hotel stay.

The interview process will consist of:

1. Written exam
2. One-on-One Personal Interview Round
3. Agricultural Issues and Agricultural Education Knowledge Interview Round
4. Group Interview Round

The election process:

- Members who are nominated for office will be announced Thursday, April 15, 2010, during the delegate business session in Vets Auditorium.
- Those members that are balloted will present a 2 minute prepared speech and a final question round in front of the delegate body.
- The 2010-2011 Iowa FFA State Officer team will be announced at the conclusion of the 4th General Session on Friday, April 16, 2010.

Following the 4th General Session a mandatory meeting will be held for the incoming and outgoing State Officer teams. The meeting will last approximately 2 hours.

STATE OFFICER CANDIDATE PERSONAL COMMITMENT FORM

State FFA officers are required to perform a demanding and exciting schedule. It is necessary that those who aspire to become officers are highly qualified, able and willing to perform. Please read the following personal commitment statement closely. When you are fully convinced that, if elected, you will, without any reservations, be fully able to carry out the role and responsibility of a state FFA officer, then sign and return with your State Officer application.

If elected to State FFA office, I will:

1. Be willing to commit the time required for State Officer activities.
2. Continue to become knowledgeable of and keep up-to-date on the industry of agriculture and career education in agriculture/agribusiness, FFA and current events.
3. Work through preparation and practice to continue to develop myself into an effective public speaker and workshop facilitator.
4. Regularly and on time write all letters, thank you notes, reports and other correspondence which are necessary and desirable.
5. Work constantly to improve my ability to carry on meaningful and enjoyable conversations with individuals of all ages and walks of life.
6. Accept and search out constructive criticism and evaluation of my total performance. Evaluate constantly my personality and attitudes making every effort to improve myself.
7. Serve as a member of the State FFA officer team, always maintaining a cooperative and supportive attitude.
8. Be willing to take and follow instructions as directed by those responsible for me.
9. Maintain and protect my health.
10. Follow the State Officer Code of Ethics:
 - a. To forego all alcohol and tobacco while involved in official or unofficial FFA activities and to avoid places or activities which in anyway would raise questions as to my moral character or conduct.
 - b. To project a positive image on any personal websites or blogs, including Facebook and MySpace. The following guidelines will be followed:
 - Pictures—all posted pictures are appropriate, promoting positive morals and behaviors.
 - Groups—any groups in which you participate should reflect a positive purpose.
 - Profiles—all interests, hobbies, etc are appropriate.
 - c. To behave in a manner which conveys and commands respect without any air of superiority.
 - d. To use wholesome language in all speeches and informal conversations and to maintain proper dress and grooming for all occasions.
 - e. To treat all team members with respect, acceptance and understanding.
 - f. To treat all FFA members equally and to avoid participation in any conversations which belittle or downgrade FFA members, fellow officers and adults.
11. Abide by all rules outlined in the Iowa FFA Association Policy for State Officers.

Policy for State Officers

In order that there are no misunderstandings, the Iowa FFA Association would like each state officer candidate and his/her parents to read and agree to the following association policies. All policies will be strictly enforced.

The following are offenses that will cause dismissal from State FFA Office:

- A. Any use or possession of alcohol (including beer and wine), including making alcohol available to others, while involved in official or unofficial FFA activities from day of election to office until installation of successor in office. This includes domestic and international travel and events.
- B. Any illegal use or possession of alcohol (including beer and wine) at all times from election until installation of successor in office.
- C. Any use and/ or supply of controlled substances (drugs), not under direction of a physician. In addition, any use of tobacco or tobacco related products is prohibited.
- D. Participation in any illicit or promiscuous acts.
- E. Commission of any felony against the laws of State or Nation.
- F. Other violations of codes of ethics and responsible behavior so identified that may be acted upon by the State FFA Board of Directors.

The above apply to any FFA activity (official or unofficial) or membership involvement by the State FFA Officers, individually or as a group.

If any of the above violations occur, the state officer or officers will be asked to appear before the entire State FFA Board of Directors to give a complete explanation of the incident which occurred. The State FFA Board of Directors will then rule on a dismissal of the officer or officers involved.
