Muscatine FFA Chapter Wins 2006 Iowa FFA Floriculture Career Development Event

The Muscatine FFA Chapter was named the Champion Team in the annual Iowa FFA Floriculture Career Development Event held at Des Moines Area Community College on the Ankeny Campus, June 15, 2006. Members of the first place team included: Felicia Wilder, Sam Crews, Leah Keefe, and Morgan Hatfield. Their Ag Education instructors are Dave Tometich and Dave Fowler. The Wapello FFA Chapter was named the Reserve Champion Team. Members of the second place team included: Megan Mairet, Kelsey Gittings, Chad Lihs, and Jeffrey Walker. Their Ag Education instructor is Irvin Meier. Jessie Juarez, from the Glenwood FFA Chapter, was named the High Individual Overall in the competition.

FFA teams from 27 chapters including 92 individuals participated in this year's Career Development Event designed to provide students an opportunity to display their agricultural knowledge and skills in the area of Floriculture. The event consisted of a general knowledge exam, problem solving and decision making, plant identification, corsage making, potting plants, plant disorders, plant design, and team situation assessment and solution.

The Floriculture Career Development Event was coordinated and conducted by Tim Doud, Neil Van Veen and staff with the Agriculture Department at Des Moines Area Community College.
